#### GREENEWAY IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT BOARD OF SUPERVISORS' MEETING MINUTES

#### FIRST ORDER OF BUSINESS

The Board of Supervisors' Meeting for the Greeneway Improvement District was called to order on Tuesday, September 18, 2018 at 3:01 p.m. at 6900 Tavistock Lakes Blvd, Suite 200, Orlando, FL 32827. Members listed below constituted a quorum.

#### SECOND ORDER OF BUSINESS

#### **Public Comment Period**

Mr. Levey announced that there were no members of the public present or on the phone.

#### THIRD ORDER OF BUSINESS

Consideration of Minutes of the August 23, 2018 Board of Supervisors' Meeting

Board Members reviewed the minutes from the August 23, 2018 Board of Supervisors' Meeting.

On Motion by Mr. Adams, second by Ms. Courtney, with all in favor, the Board of Supervisors for the Greeneway Improvement District approved the minutes of the August 23, 2018 Board of Supervisors' Meeting, as presented.

#### FOURTH ORDER OF BUSINESS

Ms. Walden stated while the District has been reviewing each month that the Fiscal Year 2018 budget has been on track Ms. Lane, the District Accountant, came across the fact that the cashflow was low in this District for Fiscal Year 2018. Ms. Lane researched this further and found that the District had Fiscal Year 2017 expenses that hit in 2018 and were paid in 2018 and those totaled \$147,000.00. Mr. Levey asked if these were non-budgeted expenses in the Fiscal Year 2018 budget. Ms. Walden stated that Ms. Lane will discuss this but noted that \$64,000.00 of it was related to the hurricane.

Ms. Lane stated that the amount of \$147,087.87 hit after Fiscal Year 2017 ended but was in the timeframe that the District Manager has for internal control reasons, booked it in 2017. They were Fiscal Year 2017 expenses booked properly in 2017 but they had to use Fiscal Year 2018 cash for it and while the District did have a carry forward of \$120,000.00 from Fiscal Year 2017 it was not enough to fully cover the entirety of what was actually Fiscal Year 2017 expenses. Mr. Levey expressed that there had to be a budget bust somewhere in Fiscal Year 2017. Ms. Lane responded that a lot of it was hurricane related which the District did not budget for at all and the District ended up putting most of that to landscaping. Mr. Levey stated that now there is a hit of \$147,000.00 in Fiscal Year 2018 that was unbudgeted. Ms. Lane replied that the full \$147,000.00 was not all hurricane and some of it was legitimate 2017 expenses that just hit after the end of the Fiscal Year. Ms. Lane stated that she has a break down that is not shown on the agenda. She expressed that \$64,000.00 was hurricane related and that was not budgeted for but the remaining was budgeted in Fiscal Year 2017. Mr. Levey stated that in Fiscal Year 2018 the District is going to have a budget deficit of some sort in 2018. Ms. Lane explained that they are not hitting the 2018 budget because this was more cash flow and not the accrued revenue. She stated that they were booked correctly in 2017 but paid for with Fiscal Year 2018 cash. It is not going to hit the Fiscal Year 2018 budget and is only showing how the cash flow went in and out. Mr. Levey asked how the District is accounting for that delta. He asked if it was being paid out of reserves. Ms. Lane stated that District staff is moving some money from the reserves into the account as the District needs it. She stated that right now she has not had to move any over for Greeneway but after September 9, 2018 the District had \$41,000.00 of cash in the account and that has gone down to about \$30,000.00 right now and once the District gets a little bit lower if the District needs to move money over from the reserves, she believes that the District has an email confirmation from Mr. Levey that the District can do that. Mr. Levey stated that he knew this was coming but did not know if the rest of the Board heard this or not.

Ms. Mackie stated that the solution that was discussed by Fishkind was to speak with Mr. Ventura about paying the 2018-2019 assessments from Lake Nona in an earlier timeframe such that the District will have an infusion of cash to the extent that reserves are not sufficient, to not only pay for the remaining fiscal year including this month but also the first three months of operating

expenses. She noted that the District typically does not have those assessments until such time as the landowners start paying their tax bills.

Mr. Levey asked if anyone was concerned about the timing of this information. Ms. Courtney stated that there was not money in the budget previously to cover hurricane expenses and asked if the District has budgeted for that going forward. Ms. Walden responded yes. Ms. Courtney asked how much is budgeted for hurricane expenses. Ms. Mackie stated that the District raised assessments overall by adding additional line items for other expenses so that the operating capital should be more and thinks that the District might be putting off the problem down the road for the end of Fiscal Year 2018-2019 if the District does have another hurricane related expense. Ms. Lane responded she thinks that they are because the District budgeted \$5,000.00 for the Hurricane Cleanup line item and if the District has another hurricane it may not be enough but the District did increase the assessments.

Mr. Levey asked about insurance. Ms. Mackie stated that the District looked at insurance in the past for landscaping and there are not that many companies that will do it and the one they found that charged an exurbanite amount to insure the landscaping. Mr. Levey asked what action District staff needed. Ms. Walden responded that that District staff is requesting a motion from the Board to ratify the action of the Chairman's actions to use the money out of reserves.

On Motion by Mr. Adams, second by Ms. Courtney, with all in favor, the Board of Supervisors for the Greeneway Improvement District ratified the actions of the Chairman to use the money out of reserves.

#### FIFTH ORDER OF BUSINESS

Consideration of Audit Engagement Letter

Ms. Walden stated that the District received this Audit Engagement Letter from Berger, Toombs and Counsel has reviewed and provided changes and they made those changes as requested. The not-to-exceed amount is \$4,395.00 which fits in with the budget. Mr. Levey asked if it was consistent with past practice. Ms. Walden responded yes.

Ms. Mackie noted that District staff needs to keep the Auditor more on task with getting an initial draft of the audit. She stated that they did not meet the expectation in the prior engagement letter and it is not unique to Berger, Toombs; she noted that they were all behind this past Fiscal Year.

On Motion by Mr. Adams, second by Ms. Courtney, with all in favor, the Board of Supervisors for the Greeneway Improvement District approved the Audit Engagement Letter with Berger, Toombs, Elam, Gaines & Frank in a not-to-exceed amount of \$4,395.00.

#### SIXTH ORDER OF BUSINESS

Consideration of OUC

Master Lighting
Installation, Upgrade and
Service Agreement Nemours Parkway Phase 6

Mr. Kaufmann stated that this is a standard OUC Agreement for the section that connects Narccoosee Road to Lake Nona. Mr. Levey asked if the lease payment will hit in Fiscal Year 2019 and if this was anticipated and budgeted for. Mr. Kaufmann responded yes. Mr. Adams asked if the lights were cobra or hats. Mr. Kaufmann responded that they are the hats until you reach the High School and then they switch to cobras. He explained that he wanted to match what should have been on Willard but the City put in something else and there will be a little discontinuity with streetlights but there is nothing the District can do about it right now.

On Motion by Mr. Adams, second by Ms. Courtney, with all in favor, the Board of Supervisors for the Greeneway Improvement District approved the OUC Master Lighting Installation, Upgrade and Service Agreement - Nemours Parkway Phase 6.

#### SEVENTH ORDER OF BUSINESS

Consideration of OUC
Master Lighting
Installation, Upgrade and
Service Agreement Centerline

Mr. Kaufmann stated that this is the same OUC Agreement for the portion of Centerline Dr. that is currently near completion.

On Motion by Mr. Adams, second by Ms. Courtney, with all in favor, the Board of Supervisors for the Greeneway Improvement District approved the OUC Master Lighting Installation, Upgrade and Service Agreement – Centerline.

#### EIGHTH ORDER OF BUSINESS

Consideration of Landscape Easement Agreements #1, 2, & 3

Ms. Mackie stated that the reason for three separate Landscape Easement Agreements are because of the varying locations and the differing ownership. She explained that the District is going to be maintaining landscaping that is outside of the right-of-way such that the District needs landscape easements over these particular areas. She noted that there may be some sections of these areas that the District will acquire in fee at a later date but for now the District needs a landscape easement for current timing purposes. She stated that the Board can approve all three agreements by one motion. Mr. Levey asked if this was anticipated in the Fiscal Year 2019 budget for landscape maintenance and then realized that this will probably fall under warranty for the first year. Ms. Mackie responded that is correct.

On Motion by Mr. Adams, second by Ms. Courtney, with all in favor, the Board of Supervisors for the Greeneway Improvement District approved Nemours Parkway Phase 6 Landscape Easement No. 1 (Lake Nona Land Company, LLC and Lake Nona Laureate Park, LLC), Nemours Parkway Phase 6 Landscape Easement No. 2 (Lake Nona Land Company, LLC) and Nemours Parkway Phase 6 Landscape Easement No. 3 (Narcoossee Land Holding Two, LLC).

#### NINTH ORDER OF BUSINESS

Consideration of Temporary Construction and Access Easement Agreement for Nemours Parkway Phase 7

Ms. Mackie stated that the basis for the temporary construction and access easement stems from negotiations with Nemours Hospital and the Developer over how drainage is going to be provided from the Nemours site while construction of Nemours Parkway Phase 7 is ongoing. This proposed Temporary Easements gives the District the ability to construct temporary drainage and continue to maintain that while construction is ongoing and once Nemours Parkway Phase 7 is completed,

the Nemours Hospital site or a portion of the site, will drain through the right-of-way. She stated that this was discovered during discussions between the Developer and Nemours at the time that they were negotiating other easements. Mr. Newton added that it is a constructability issue. He noted that the District is trying to build a road over top of a drainage ditch that conveys Nemours drainage and parts of the drainage will have to be relocated during construction.

On Motion by Mr. Adams, second by Ms. Courtney, with all in favor, the Board of Supervisors for the Greeneway Improvement District approved the Temporary Construction and Access Easement Agreement with Lake Nona Land Company, LLC for Nemours Parkway Phase 7.

#### TENTH ORDER OF BUSINESS

Consideration of Interlocal
Agreement with Boggy
Creek Improvement
District Regarding Certain
Costs Associated with the
Construction of Nemours
Parkway

Ms. Mackie explained that this deals with Nemours Parkway Phase 7. Exhibit A shows a coloring system on the graphic that denotes property within the Greeneway Improvement District and the Boggy Creek Improvement District. She noted that when this right-of-way was expanded a small portion of the Boggy Creek ID funded Nemours Parkway Phase 7 is actually in the Greeneway ID. Based upon the cost estimates that were developed by the Engineer the Interlocal Agreement would provide that the section to the right of the black line will be funded by the Greeneway ID and to the left will be funded by the Boggy Creek ID despite the fact that that small strip is located within the Greeneway ID. She noted that the Interlocal Agreement would provide for the construction and ongoing maintenance in the future.

On Motion by Mr. Adams, second by Ms. Courtney, with all in favor, the Board of Supervisors for the Greeneway Improvement District approved the Interlocal Agreement with Boggy Creek Improvement District Regarding Certain Costs Associated with the Construction of Nemours Parkway.

On Motion by Mr. Adams, second by Ms. Courtney, with all in favor, the Board of Supervisors for the Greeneway Improvement District ratified the Operation and Maintenance Expenditures paid in August 2018 in an amount totaling \$89,476.04.

#### THIRTEENTH ORDER OF BUSINESS

Recommendation of Work Authorizations/Proposed Services

Mr. Kaufmann presented the following Work Authorizations to the Board:

1. Donald W. McIntosh in the amount of \$6,725.00 for additional gravity sewer and reclaimed water service lines for Nemours Hospital in Nemours Parkway Phase 7.

On Motion by Mr. Adams, second by Ms. Courtney, with all in favor, the Board of Supervisors for the Greeneway Improvement District approved the Work Authorization from Donald W. McIntosh Associates, Inc. in the amount of \$6,725.00 for Nemours Parkway Phase 7.

2. Donald W. McIntosh in the amount of \$257,630.00 for survey, design and construction admin for 2,220 LF roadway for Segments A & B for Centerline Drive.

On Motion by Mr. Adams, second by Ms. Courtney, with all in favor, the Board of Supervisors for the Greeneway Improvement District approved the Work Authorization from Donald W. McIntosh Associates, Inc. in the amount of \$257,630.00 for Centerline Drive – Segments A & B.

- 3. Donald W. McIntosh in the amount of \$290,695.00 for survey, design and construction admin for 2,465 LF roadway for Segments C & D for Centerline Drive. Mr. Kaufmann stated that there is a bridge that will eventually be installed here which is not part of this proposal. Mr. Levey asked if the bridge design comes back to the Board. Ms. Mackie responded that the District will have to go out for an RFQ for that. Mr. Levey asked how they would complete the design of C & D without a bridge designer. Mr. Newton stated that they anticipate it being a box culvert rather than a bridge. Mr. Kaufmann added that the Developer has not weighed in on what they want. Mr. Newton stated that the District would need to engage a Structural Engineer. Mr. Adams asked if segment C was complete. Mr. Newton indicated that there are improvements going on in section C and it is being widened to include on street parking and a 12-foot trail and a number of utility adjustments and relocations. Mr. Levey asked if it is the same cost as if the District is designing a new road. Mr. Newton replied that it is not the same cost but it is still pretty complicated. Mr. Levey asked if the Developer has provided feedback on this design proposal. Mr. Kaufmann replied no. Mr. Levey asked if Mr. Adams wanted to move forward or wait 30 days. Mr. Adams stated that he would rather table this Work Authorization pending the next Board Meeting.
- 4. Professional Services Industries, Inc. in the amount of \$1,300.00 for a study to determine alternative underdrain designs.

On Motion by Mr. Adams, second by Ms. Courtney, with all in favor, the Board of Supervisors for the Greeneway Improvement District approved the Work Authorization from Professional Services Industries in the amount of \$1,300.00 for roadway underdrain details.

#### FOURTEENTH ORDER OF BUSINESS

Review of District's Financial Position and Budget to Actual YTD

Board Members reviewed the District's statement of financial position. Ms. Walden noted that the District has expenses of \$679,000.00 vs. a budget of \$682,000.00. The District is currently under budget through August 2018 by just over \$3,000.00. There was no action required.

Mr. Newton circulated the Construction Contract Status Memorandum (Minutes Exhibit A). He explained that Nemours Parkway Phase 5 is closed out but there are clean up items and he thought that there would be a Change Order this month but there is not one yet.

Mr. Newton explained that for Nemours Parkway Phase 6 he did a final walk through inspection with the City Inspector last Friday and are in the midst of preparing a punch list. Other than that, it is substantially complete except for some hand rail along the top of the box culvert. Mr. Levey asked when that will be open. Mr. Newton responded that he is hoping this month.

Mr. Newton explained that for Nemours Parkway Phase 7 there is a preconstruction meeting on September 25, 2018 and the permit issuance is pending payment of the permit fee.

Mr. Newton explained that the Lake Nona Kellogg Avenue Extension paving commenced yesterday. The only thing left after the pavement is the potable water and reclaimed water connections to the City park.

Mr. Newton stated that there are two Change Orders attached to the memo and one of them is a deductive Change Order #3 in the amount of \$2,146.88 which is a Developer portion of the project which has to do with some revisions related to OUC electric and streetlighting layout configuration. He noted that there are maps attached. He noted that the net Change Order amount to the Developer is actually a credit in the amount of \$2,146.88.

He stated that the next Change Order is additive to the District in the amount of \$65,127.18 because the streetlighting included only an allowance in the bid and there were some significant changes by OUC including changing their switch gear location which resulted in a lot of extra conduit and an access road to get to the switch gear. Mr. Levey asked if OUC approved the original plans. Mr. Newton stated that OUC provided the information that was put in the original plans. He noted that the Engineer does not design the conduit. Mr. Levey asked where the original plans came from OUC and there were changes required by the park site and it necessitated the OUC changes. Mr. Newton stated that the switch gear was originally next to the park and it moved into Phase 4.

Mr. Newton recommended that the Board approve Deductive Change Order #3 in the amount of \$2,146.88 for the Developer portion and approve Additive Change Order #4 in the amount of \$65,127.18 for the District portion.

On Motion by Mr. Adams, second by Ms. Courtney, with all in favor, the Board of Supervisors for the Greeneway Improvement District approved the action of the Construction Contract Status Memorandum dated September 18, 2018.

**Construction Supervisor** – Mr. Kaufmann requested to change the makeup of the Construction Committee by replacing Stephen Flint with Troy Davidson. The

Board asked who Mr. Davidson is. Mr. Kaufmann responded that he is the new Project Engineer working for the Developer.

On Motion by Mr. Adams, second by Ms. Courtney, with all in favor, the Board of Supervisors for the Greeneway Improvement District approved replacing Mr. Stephen Flint with Mr. Troy Davidson.

#### SIXTEENTH ORDER OF BUSINESS

Supervisor and Audience Comments & Adjournment

Ms. Courtney asked when the District should expect RFPs for these segments of Centerline. Mr. Newton stated it is to be determined because it is currently in preliminary design. Ms. Mackie stated that it is anticipated that there will be an Interlocal Agreement between the two Districts on cost responsibility and the Engineer's Report is in development now for that District.

There were no audience comments. Mr. Levey requested a motion to adjourn.

Please accept this correspondence as a current summary of our construction contract status. Listed below by project is a brief summary of recent contract activity. Copies of the latest Change Order logs are attached.

CML ENGINEERS

#### Nemours Parkway Phase 5 – Jr. Davis Construction, Inc. / BrightView

LAND PLANNERS

Construction Status: The Notification of Project Completion was submitted to the City on June 21, 2018, with the maintenance bond submitted under separate cover on July 2, 2018. The South Florida Water Management District (SFWMD) construction certification was submitted on June 22, 2018, and the SFWMD certification acceptance was received on July 3, 2018. Although the project has effectively been closed out, there are outstanding issues related to:

SURVEYORS

- Modifications to street lights and associated modifications to electrical conduits, pullboxes and landscaping.
- Relocation of irrigation controller and associated electrical service.

Both of these issues are being evaluated by District staff and may result in one or more change orders and additional project costs.



Change Order (C.O.) Status: None at this time.

#### Nemours Parkway Phase 6 - Jr. Davis Construction, Inc. / BrightView
